
Scope and Purpose of Study

Purpose

To provide Policy makers with an understanding of the magnitude of the Port's impact within Shelby County.











Overview of the Port of Memphis



Memphis Waterfront 1941







- 1949 Construction started
- 1951 Complete
- 8 mile/12 km long still water harbor
- 300 ft./91m wide channel











Location

- 640 river miles north of New Orleans
- 400 river miles south of St. Louis
- Jurisdiction extends from miles 715.5 to 741.0 on Mississippi River
- Three slack water harbors
 - McKellar Lake Harbor
 - Pidgeon Industrial Harbor
 - Wolf River Harbor




Memphis Area

- Memphis MSA consists of 8 counties in Tennessee, Mississippi and Arkansas
- MSA population is 1.2 million
- City of Memphis is 17 largest city in U.S.
- The Port of Memphis is situated at the strategic central location on the inland waterway system
- Memphis is known worldwide as America's Distribution Center.

Port Designations

- U.S. Customs Port of Entry
- Foreign Trade Zone #77
- U.S. Corps of Engineers Memphis District operation covers 355 miles of the Mississippi River
 - \$200 million capital investment
 - 170 employees

Summary of Impacts

- Overall economic impact is \$5.5 billion annually.
- 16,765 jobs are supported within Shelby County by the port and its related operations.

Homeland Security Investments

- Department of Homeland Security selected the Port of Memphis as a "best practices" model for high tech security measures
- \$1,356,067 Homeland Security grants received
- Economic impact of \$2.4 million for these grants



Super Terminal Projections

Cost	\$25 million
Annual Lifts	200,000
Construction & Startup Impact	\$50.5 million one time
Economic Impact of Operations	\$15.6 million annually
Total Employment	58
Local Tax Revenues	\$94,000







Factors Point to Future Growth

- Barge shipments are 10-15% less expensive than truck or rail
- Waterways are the most fuel efficient mode of transporting freight
- Increased rail and truck intermodal capabilities
- Existing facilities are broadening capabilities
 - Fullen Dock & Warehouse Container handling
 - Barnhart Crane & Rigging Project Cargoes
