










Norfolk International Terminals



- Green transportation alternative




U.S. Containerized Cargo Forecast





VIRGINIA Value of Cargo from The Port of Virginia - 2010







Post-Panamax Locks






- At 1,105 feet long, the MSC Bruxelles holds the record for the biggest containership ever to enter the Hampton Roads Harbor.

VIRGINIA Virginia Sets Deep Draft Record with MSC Roma



The Port of Virginia set a mark that no other port on the US East Coast could equal: it loaded a containership so heavy that it needed 48.5 feet of water to sail.
