

- The Station at Potomac Yard mixed-use residential

Boston Landing Station



- Adjacent to New Balance corporate HQ
- \$14-16 million construction cost entirely funded by New Balance
- Part of \$500 million,
 15-acre real estate
 development project by
 New Balance subsidiary

Boston Landing Development



- 15-acre real estate development project by NB Development Group
- \$500 million in projects
- 650,000 sf office space
- 250,000 sf corporate HQ,
 700 employees
- 80,000 sf ground floor retail and restaurant space
- 275 apartments
- Boston Bruins practice facility
- 175-key boutique hotel

- American Blvd. (METRO Blue Line)
- City of Ramsey (Northstar CRT)
- METRO Green Line







METRO Blue Line (Hiawatha LRT)



- 12-mile light rail line with 19 stations
- Passenger service began 2004
- Connection to METRO
 Green Line and Northstar
 Commuter Rail at Target
 Field (Minneapolis)





American Boulevard Station: History

1998

- Locally Preferred Alternative (LPA) approved
- No station at American Boulevard

2002

- Municipal consent process
- Deferred station added at American Boulevard

2008/09

- Funding by local agencies and under FHWA Congestion
 Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) program
- Bloomington Port Authority funding








- City of Bloomington sees station as key component of South Loop District
- Station area to accommodate 2/3 of city's forecasted growth in population, housing and employment through 2050
- Attracting national developers, Hyatt, Marriott, Lennar





Northstar Commuter Rail



- 40-mile commuter rail line with 7 stations
- Passenger service began November 2009
- Connection to METRO
 Green and Blue Lines at
 Target Field (Minneapolis)

The COR:

- 400 acres commercial, residential & recreation
- Over \$80 million in new projects in construction or contracted (2012)
- 60,000 sf medical
- 300 units residential
- \$65 million TIF funding













Persons below poverty level per acre by Census block group (2000)

2006

- DEIS published with 15 stations with 1 mile spacing
- No stations included at Hamline, Victoria and Western
- Public comments on DEIS support adding stations

2007/09

- Strong community advocacy to add stations at Hamline, Victoria and Western
- Preliminary Engineering and environmental work proceeds with 15 stations, adds infrastructure for future build out of 3 stations

2010

- Federal government changes CEI rules
- Local funding secured to add the 3 stations
- Supplemental EA published







Environmental Assessment

- 2009 Final EIS limited to installation of below-grade infrastructure for infill stations
- 2010 EA evaluated social, economic and environmental impacts for complete stations
- Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI)





Cost Effectiveness Index

SAFETEA-LU

- Incremental cost per hour of transportation user benefits
- Focus on travel time savings
- Comparison of BASELINE vs. BUILD conditions
- Prior to 2010, CEI required Medium rating to pass



Development at Green Line Infill Stations



Hamline Station mixed-use residential:

- \$28 million total investment
- 108 affordable units in 2 buildings
- 13,700 sf commercial space
- Replaced vacant used-car lot
- Construction began fall 2015



Model Cities redevelopment:

- \$25 million total investment
- Affordable housing and retail
- Phase 1: New four-story building with 35 units near Victoria Station
- Planned Phase 2: residential development east of Victoria
