Fixing America's Surface Transportation or the "FAST Act"


- Signed on December 4, 2015 by President Obama
- Pub. L. No. 114-94
- Authorized \$305 billion (FY2016 through FY2020)

for highway, highway and motor vehicle safety, public transportation, motor carrier safety, hazardous materials safety, rail, and research, technology, and statistics programs

- Maintains focus on safety
- Keeps structure of the various highway-related programs
- Continues to streamline project delivery
- Provides dedicated funding for freight projects
