#### What is the NHTS?

The National Household Travel Survey (NHTS) is a periodic national survey conducted by FHWA that provides travel and transportation pattern data to transportation planners and policy makers in the United States. The survey has been conducted every 5-8 years since 1969 – nearly 50 years of data!

#### NHTS 2017:

 Data collected on trips taken by all members of participating households over a 24-hour period.






Means of Transportation









Time of day/day of week






#### **DATA COLLECTION:**


- April 2016 April 2017, with data collected across 365 days of the year.
- The final travel day assigned was April 30, 2017 and data collection ended in early May.
- Respondents were encouraged to record all travel, even if "out of town" on travel day
- Complete household 100% of all household members (5 years and above) responded
- Data collection ended with approximately 130,000 completed surveys.


