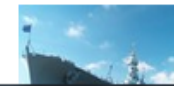

KDOT's response to K-10 advocacy Fb campaign, April 20, 2011

It mentions that most of these highways were designed with broad, gently-sloped medians to allow drivers to recover without injury or damage. The post also states that KDOT and other government agencies must operate within limited resources. It references a study by Dr. Dean Sicking from the University of Nebraska, which led to the implementation of cable median barriers in Kansas. Two projects are mentioned: one on U.S. 75 north of Topeka and another on K-96 in Sedgwick County. The post concludes by stating that KDOT will conduct studies every three years to assess the safety benefits of these barriers and will begin the review process again next year. It also mentions that while cable barriers have reduced fatalities, they can still cause injury and damage, and that KDOT's hearts go out to the families of those who lost their lives in a recent crash on K-10 between Eudora and DeSoto. The post ends with a reassurance that safety is at the core of everything KDOT does and that they will do their best with the resources available to keep other Kansas families and communities from suffering.
