

- Maintained by the Transportation Research Board (TRB)


TRID Gives You a Head Start

Quality in, quality out


- TRB/HRB publications back to 1923

- Commercial journal literature: ASCE, IEEE, Elsevier, Springer, Taylor & Francis, Sage, just to name a few
- Conference proceedings
- International coverage: ITRD (Europe), ATRI (Australia), J-STAGE (Japan)
 - Records in German, French and Spanish

Content is curated, or chosen for academic and intellectual rigor, ensuring high quality information from peer-reviewed journals, conference papers, government publications.

TRID = Efficient Searching




TRID = Precise Searching




- <u>Subject Areas</u> can ensure your results are in the proper context
- <u>Source</u>: limit to TRB, US DOT, State DOT, ITRD, et al.
- Use the <u>Index Term</u> field to search the Transportation Research Thesaurus (TRT) for a high degree of precision
- Use <u>Result Type</u> drop-down to select the types of publications you are interested in

TRID = Greater Relevant Results




Sharing TRID Results Is Easy!



TRID Convenience

Combine previous searches using Boolean operators (AND, OR, NOT) and Set numbers, then click the Create button.



TRID's new Search History will remember up to 50 of your most recent searches. You can go here to resume or modify search strategies you started earlier, even the previous day. Re-run frequently executed searches or combine multiple searches using BOOLEAN logic (AND/OR) to create a new result set.
