The information supplied in TRB's National Cooperative Highway Research Program (NCHRP) Report 672: Roundabouts: An Informational Guide—Second Edition builds extensively on the first edition published in 2000 by the Federal Highway Administration and is based on established and emerging U.S. practices and recent research. The guide continues to be comprehensive in recognition of the diverse needs of transportation professionals and the public for introductory material, planning and design guidance, operational and safety performance evaluation techniques, construction and maintenance information, and the wide range of potential applications of roundabouts.
