US Coast Guard Overview

- 36,000 Active Duty; 7,000 Civilians
- 1,500 Boats, 240 Cutters, 190 Aircraft
- \$6.78 Billion – Operating Expenses

- 17,000 SAR Cases, 3,400 lives saved
- \$3B in drugs removed
- Screened 212,00 vessels and 30 million crew prior to arrival

Ports, Waterways, and Coastal Security (PWCS)

Protection of the U.S. Maritime Domain and the U.S. Marine Transportation System (MTS) and those who live, work or recreate near them; the prevention and disruption of terrorist attacks, sabotage, espionage, or subversive acts; and response to and recovery from those that do occur.

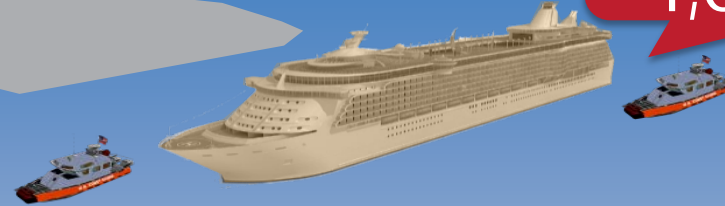

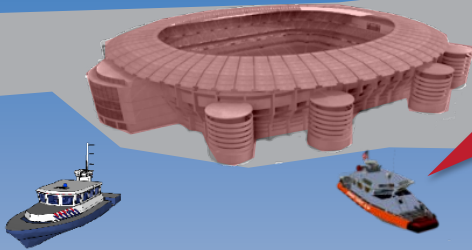

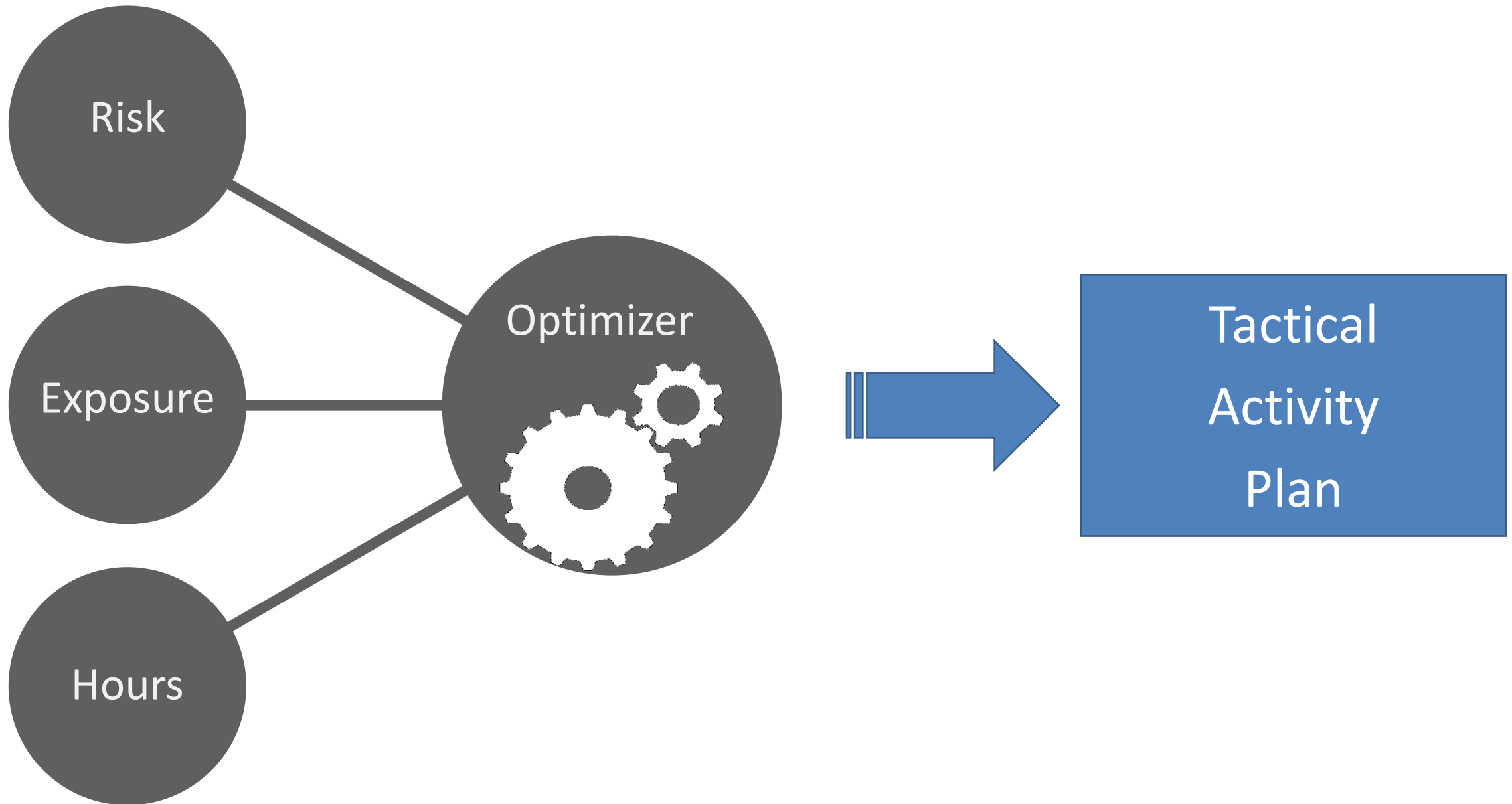
