PART 3: Committee Future Outlook Statement and Committee Three-Year Plan

Committee Future Outlook Statement

Strategy 1: Identify and disseminate comparisons of DoD transportation operations best practices and commercial operations best practices.

- Sponsor research, workshops and presentations of DOD surge, deployment, sustainment, and re-deployment transportation operations, and private sector commercial supply chain best practice standards for similar operations.

Strategy 2: Promote research and case studies of DoD capacity and throughput shortfalls and successes in infrastructure, conveyances, human capital, and security during mobilizations, emergencies and other operations.

- Identify researchers and agencies that are addressing current and future shortfalls (technology, incentives, processes, and legislation/policy) and include them in committee meetings, workshops and presentations.
- Include in the Committee active DoD transportation and logistics planners and representatives of the services and DoD staff.
- Sponsor research, workshops and presentations of DOD surge, deployment, sustainment, and re-deployment transportation operations.
- Support review of alternative energy strategies that support DoD transportation and supply chain operations to increase energy efficiency and security.

Strategy 3: Provide a forum for information exchange between DoD, its military components, transportation providers, and other transportation related organizations with an interest in national security.

- Determine challenges that transportation providers face in maintaining capacity for deployments and national emergencies. Include transportation providers in the Committee.
- Propose research to eliminate or reduce the gaps and problems.
- Maintain relationships with other TRB committees with interests in national security.

Strategy 4: Provide a forum for identifying installation and community transportation issues.

- Establish a relationship with other TRB committees that have an interest in the relationship between military installations and the surrounding civilian community.
- Sponsor research and presentations on examples of military and civilian community collaboration.
- Sponsor research, workshops and presentations on the impacts of the Base Realignment and Closure Commission (BRAC) on surrounding communities and the effectiveness of mitigation.

Committee Three-Year Plan

During the next three years, we will undertake the following strategies and actions to address the emerging, critical, and cross-cutting issues identified above:

Strategy 1 - Identify and disseminate comparisons of DoD transportation operations best practices and commercial operations best practices.

Tri-Annual Actions:

1.1 Organize and co-sponsor sessions at the TRB Annual Meeting;

- 1.2 Organize and co-sponsor summer sessions and workshops with other TRB committees;
- 1.3 Collaborate on sessions and workshops involving other organizations.
- 1.4 Broaden membership and friends of the committee and encourage their active participation in committee activities to recruit young members and achieve a diverse representation from all regions of the United States and abroad. This includes reaching out in-depth to private sector companies and the US Department of Defense and DHS.
- 1.5 Encourage research, panel sessions and papers on collaborative processes involving the public and private sectors, along with academic institutions.

Strategy 2 - Promote research and case studies of DoD capacity and throughput shortfalls and successes in infrastructure, conveyances, human capital, and security during mobilizations, emergencies and other operations.

Tri-Annual Actions:

- 2.1 Solicit papers for publication;
- 2.2 Hold special conferences and workshops every two to three years;
- 2.3 Sponsor at least one session in the annual TRB winter meeting and in relevant summer meetings;
- 2.4 Publicize the committee website to showcase our activities; and
- 2.5 Highlight annual awards of excellence.

Strategy 3 - Provide a forum for information exchange between DoD, its military components, transportation providers, and other transportation related organizations with an interest in national security.

Tri-Annual Actions:

The Committee will strive to identify and assist members who are willing to undertake the tasks and efforts as noted above. To that end, once a task is accepted, a time line for action will be developed and shared with Section and TRB staff.

Strategy 4 - Provide a forum for identifying installation and community transportation issues.

Tri-Annual Actions:

- 4.1 Continue to Co-Sponsor the Sub-Committee on Transportation in Military Communities and associated sessions at Annual Meetings.
- 4.2 Ensure Committee research efforts, e.g., Calls for Papers and Poster Sessions include military community transportation issues, as appropriate.
