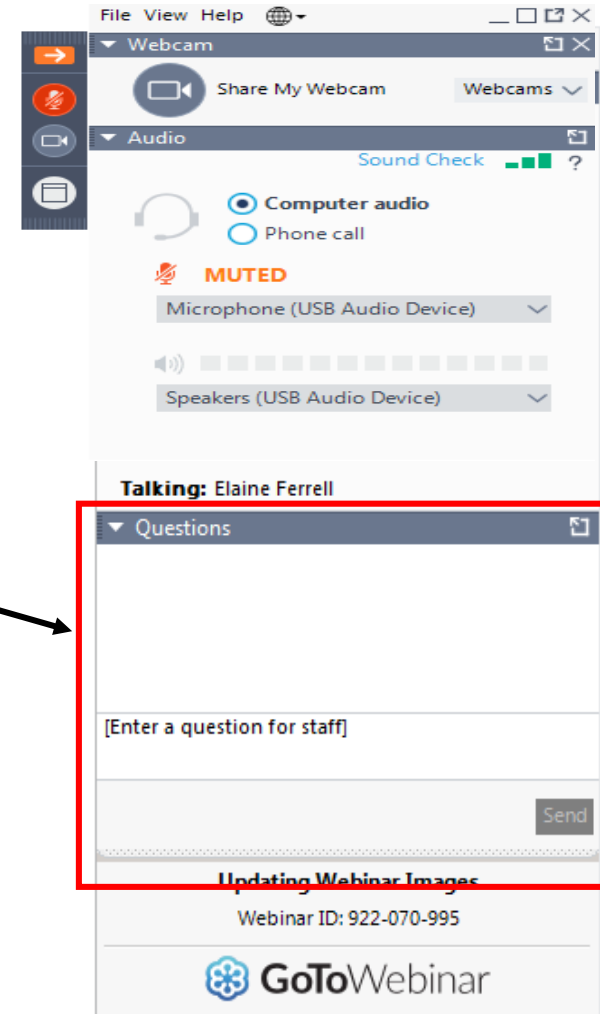

Advantage of Using Citation Management Tools

- Download citations and articles/PDFs from websites and databases
- Organize and search citations and articles
- Easily generate reports
- Easily share references with others
- Automate the writing of your endnotes/bibliographies/footnotes: integration with Word

Sharing Libraries: EndNote

EndNote customers have access to EndNoteWeb:

- Register/login at Endnote.com
- Sync with desktop version
- Manage access to groups: read only; read-write

Create a Compressed Library (.enlx) that can be easily sent to other EN users

– Includes all attachments and customization

Sharing Libraries: Zotero

- Register for access to Web Library at zotero.org
- Storage beyond 300 MB is fee-based
- Sync desktop version to Web Library



Marking Results from TRID

After running or refining your search, use the 'Mark' functionality to tell TRID which records you'd like to export

Using Marked Records

Used the 'Marked Records' feature below the search bar to Save records to your citation management tool. You can also Print or Email records from here.



RIS Format

Go with the Default RIS selection to begin exporting to your citation management tool. RIS is designed to work with all Reference/Citation management tools.

Save Marked Records

Format:

Citation
Plain text format for a reference citation.

Citation & Abstract
Plain text format for a reference citation which also includes the record abstract or description.

RIS
Default format for reference management tools: EndNote, Refworks, etc.

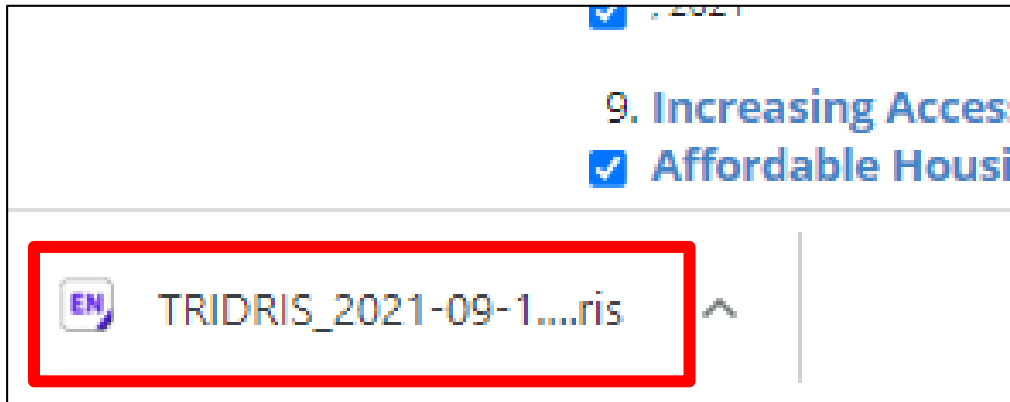
Microsoft Word
Full record output in Microsoft Word document format. Records are separated by page breaks.

XML
Structured output of full record data in XML for use in data transfer or import.

HTML
Full record output as a web page for print or display in a browser.

To EndNote with Chrome

After clicking Download in the previous dialog, you should see the file at the bottom of the browser window. If you've associated .RIS files with EndNote, just click the file to begin the export

The records will automatically populate the Imported References group. You can assign them to an existing group or create a new group, etc.

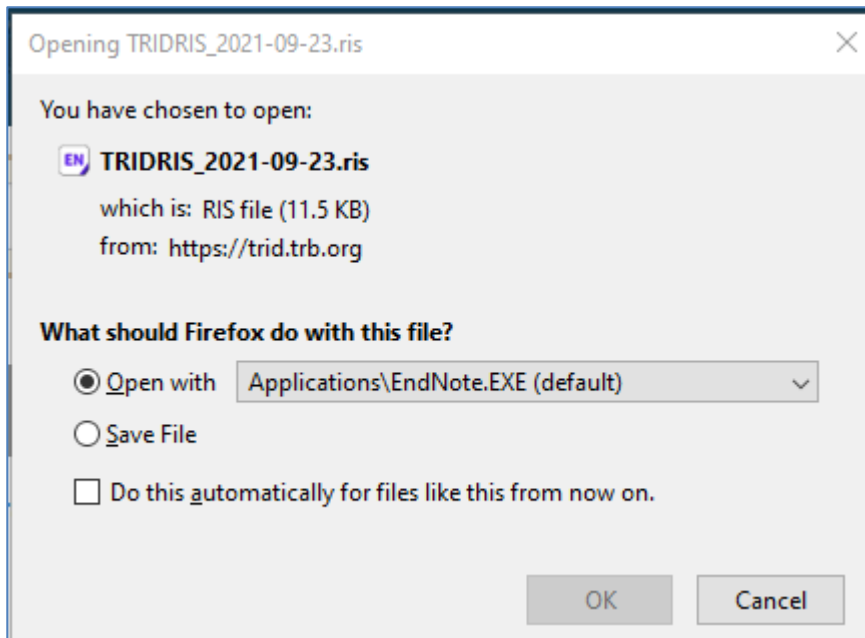
To Zotero with Chrome

If you have associated RIS files with Zotero in your operating system, the file will automatically export to Zotero from TRID as it did to EndNote.

Otherwise you can: Click Show in Folder, then right-click the file in your Downloads folder and select: Open with>Zotero

To EndNote with FireFox

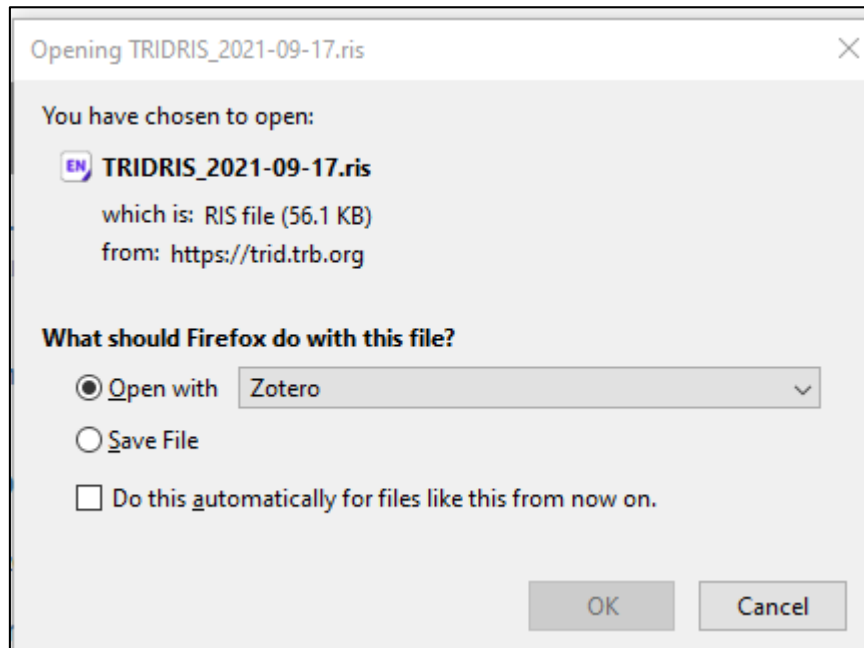
You'll see the dialog below after clicking **Download**:

To Zotero with FireFox

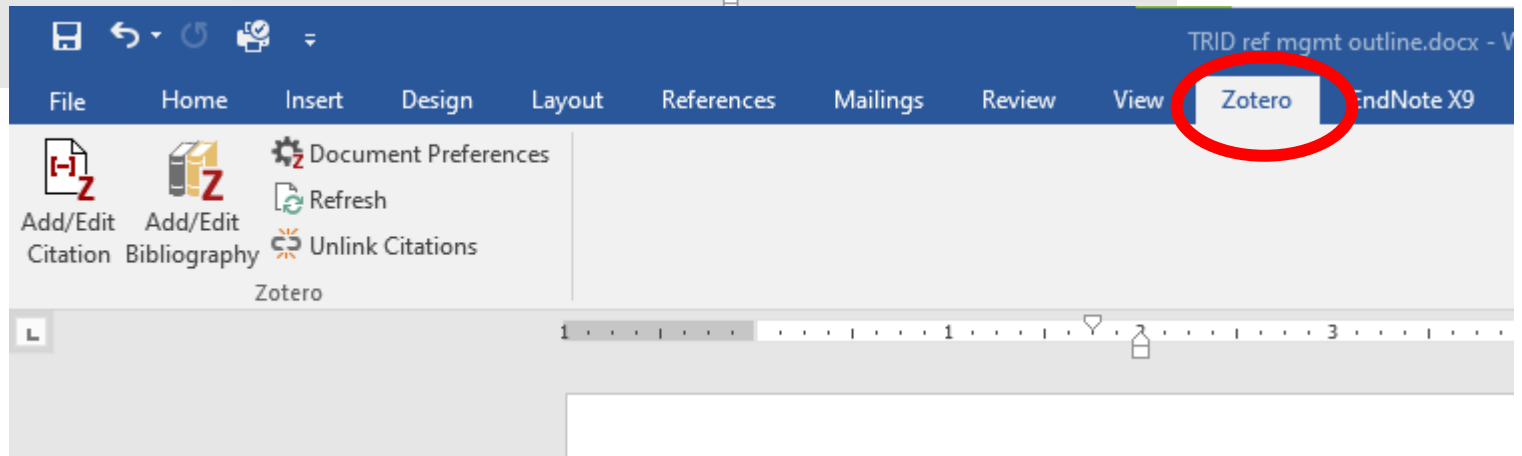
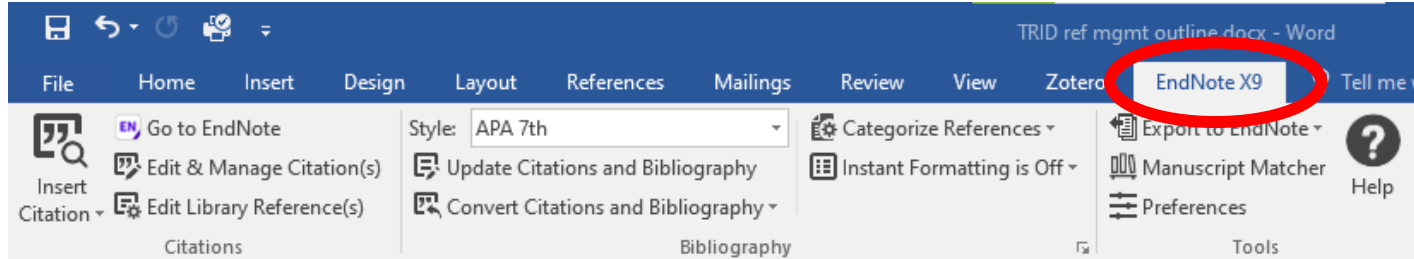
